RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A NEW PARKING
RESOLUTION FOR UNION TOWNSHIP

The Board of Trustees of Union Township, Clermont County, Ohio,
met in regular session on the 8th day of September, 1987, with the following
members present:

Carl D. Walker

Dennis N. Cook

Richard L. Martin

Mr. Cook moved for the adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A NEW PARKING
RESOLUTION FOR UNION TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union Township has determined
that the public safety and welfare would be served by adopting fire lane,
parking and related regulations; and

WHEREAS, such regulation does not conflict with the Uniform Traffic
Act and is subject to the restrictions, limitations, and exceptions of
O.R.C. §4511.01 to 4511.76 and O.R.C. §4513.01 to 4513.37; and

WHEREAS, the regulations are applicable only to the unincorporated
areas of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union Township desire to exercise
their police powers and authority pursuant to O.R.C. §'s 505.17, 4511.07, and
4511.01(A)(a).

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND RESOLVED AND HEREBY DETERMINED, by
the Board of Trustees of Union Township that:

1. Parking is prohibited on established roadways proximate to
buildings in all shopping centers, schools, hospitals and high density apart-
ment complexes in the township where parking accommodations for more than
ten (10) motor vehicles is provided.

2. Traffic control devices conforming to O.R.C. §4511.09 shall be
installed to designate restrictions and regulations imposed herein.

3. Parking of vehicles is prohibited within an intersection. Further, parking of vehicles is prohibited where parking is restricted by signs including handicapped parking zones and snow emergency zones.

4. Parking is prohibited in any fire lane.

5. Parking is prohibited within thirty (30) feet of or upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic control device.

6. Parking is prohibited within thirty (30) feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station within seventy-five (75) feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs.

7. Parking is prohibited upon any street or road within the township, unless the wheels of the vehicle next to the street or road are within twelve (12) inches from the edge of the traveled portion of the road, or of the pavement.

8. Parking is prohibited in cul de sacs on any township street.

9. Parking is permitted on township streets of at least twenty-four (24) feet width with curb and gutter but is restricted to the side of the street opposite fire hydrants. On streets of sufficient width without fire hydrants, the side of street permitted for parking shall be appropriately marked and designated.

10. Parking is prohibited on township streets where there is no curb, regardless of the width of the street.

11. Parking is prohibited at a curb which is painted yellow unless otherwise directed by the police officer.

12. Where parking is permitted by this Resolution, there shall be a 72-continuous-hour limitation.

13. Where parking is permitted by this Resolution, no vehicle shall be stopped or parked on a road or highway with the vehicle facing in a direction other than the direction of travel on that side of the road or highway.

14. Parking of vehicles is prohibited in the space between the curbs and sidewalks.

15. Parking is prohibited in the non-traveled portion of a township street or highway right-of-way.

16. No person shall stop, park, or leave standing on any street in the township, except state or county roads, any vehicle exceeding a gross weight of five (5) tons, or a commercial tractor, or truck, or trailer, or semi trailer or boat except when such parking is necessary to load or unload property, to perform other business services requiring the parking of such vehicle, to comply with the provisions of O.R.C. Chapter 4511, or to obey the directions of a police officer or a traffic control device. Vehicles parked for loading or unloading or to perform other business services on or along public roads must be connected to a towing vehicle at all times.

Operators of vehicles so parked within the unincorporated area of the township shall limit such parking to a reasonable period of time to perform the loading or unloading or other business service.

For purposes of this section, the following definitions will apply:

a. "Commercial tractor" shall mean every motor vehicle having motor power designed or used for drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to carry any load while carrying a portion of such other vehicles, or the load thereon, or both.

B. "Semi-trailer" shall mean every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property with another and separate motor vehicle so that in operation a part of its own weight or that of its load, or both, rests upon and is carried by another vehicle.

C. "Trailer" shall mean every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property wholly on its own structure and for being drawn by a motor vehicle, including any such vehicle when formed by or operated as a combination of a semi-trailer and a vehicle of the dolly type, such as that commonly known as a "trailer dolly". "Trailer" shall also mean all house vehicles, recreational vehicles, and motor homes.

D. "Truck" shall mean every motor vehicle, except trailers and semi-trailers, designed and used to carry property, except pick-up trucks not being used for commercial purposes.

E. "Boat" shall mean every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property upon the water.

17. The Board of Trustees is charged with the control of parking as authorized by the statutes of Ohio, and may in conformity therewith regulate parking not otherwise provided for hereunder. Any such restrictions or of parking on township streets shall be made with the best interest of safety to the public and the streets so restricted shall be properly marked with signs conforming to O.R.C. §4511.09, or with yellow paint.

18. The Board of Trustees hereby appoints the township road superintendent or his appointee, with the duty of placing and erecting signs in accordance with this Resolution.

19. If any vehicle is found upon the street, highway, alley, park or other public ground in the township in violation of any provisions of this Resolution of the township, regulating the stop or standing, or parking of vehicles, and the identity of the driver cannot be determined, the owner or person whose name such vehicle is registered shall be held prima facie responsible for such violation.

20. The Chief of Police of the township police department, or any members of the Union Township Police Department, or the Sheriff of Clermont County, or any of his deputies, may order into storage any vehicle parked in violation of the township parking resolution, pursuant to O.R.C. §505.17(D).

21. Any vehicle which is parked in a tow-away zone in accordance with this parking resolution, the owner and operator of such vehicle shall be deemed to have consented to the removal and storage of the vehicle. The owner or any lien holder of any vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership which may be evidenced by a Certificate of Title to the vehicle and payment of all expenses, charges and fines incurred as a result of the parking violation, removal and storage of the vehicle. The towing charges for towing shall not exceed the amount of \$50.00 and the storage charge not to exceed \$5.00 per 24-hour period. However, if the owner or operator of the vehicle arrives after the vehicle has been prepared for removal, but prior to its actual removal from the zone, the owner or operator shall be given the opportunity to pay a fee of no more than one-half of the normal towing charge of the towing company who has prepared the vehicle for removal in order to obtain release of the vehicle. Upon payment of this fee, the vehicle shall be released to the owner or operator and upon said release of the vehicle the owner or operator immediately shall remove the vehicle so that it is not parked in a tow-away zone as established by this Resolution.

22. Whoever violates this Resolution is guilty of a minor misdemeanor, with a maximum fine of \$100.00 per violation. Fines levied and collected under this Resolution shall be paid into the township General Revenue Fund pursuant to O.R.C. §505.17(E).

23. The township Clerk is directed to post these regulations in five (5) conspicuous public places in the township for thirty (30) consecutive days and publish the same in a newspaper of general circulation in the township for three (3) consecutive weeks.

24. At the completion of the times for posting and publication of these regulations, all other parking resolutions of this township are thereby repealed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Union Township hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board which result in formal action, were.


